# 1. About CATIE

1.1 CATIE (legal name: Canadian AIDS Treatment Information Exchange) is a national, not-for-profit charity committed to improving the health and quality of life of all people in Canada living with, or at risk of, HIV or hepatitis C. We provide information in various formats to healthcare professionals and many different community-based organizations whose clients are living with, or at risk of, these viruses and, potentially, other sexually transmitted and blood-borne infections (STBBIs).

CATIE writes and publishes resources, either developed in-house or collaboratively with research, medical and healthcare organizations, that are distributed free to healthcare and frontline service providers across Canada.

Beyond CATIE's principal website ([www.catie.ca](http://www.catie.ca)) and CATIE's Ordering Centre website ([www.orders.catie.ca](http://www.orders.catie.ca)), CATIE manages the HIV411.ca / HCV411.ca website ([www.HIV411.ca](http://www.HIV411.ca)). This website is a portal that uses Google maps functionality to list and show the location of healthcare and community-based agencies across Canada that serve people living with and at the risk for HIV or hepatitis C. Please note that HIV411.ca and HCV411.ca are aliases for the same website.

This RFP is for work that will enhance the functionality, usability and readability of the site with the aim of making it mobile-friendly and easy to administer. This project would entail an initial assessment to determine the degree to which the site would need to be revamped, and then the subsequent work that would be required.

CATIE is open to either improving and upgrading the current website or replacing the existing website with a new application. Respondents are encouraged to provide pricing for both options.

## 2. Background to the RFP

HIV411.ca and HCV411.ca were developed in order to provide ready information to people who are living with HIV/AIDS and hepatitis C (HCV), or who may be at risk of acquiring these viruses, about where they can go to find the health services they need.

The site has a long history – first developed with a sole focus on HIV, then expanding to include HCV – with a consortium of health service agencies.

The development of an accessible, coordinated HIV/AIDS service information system was identified as a priority by the Information and Access Working Group, who at the time was being led by the Ontario HIV Treatment Network

(OHTN). The Information and Access Working Group built upon earlier local initiatives and the provincial ASO411 was created.

In 2009, CATIE joined the Working Group and, with additional assistance from Le Portail VIH/sida du Québec, adapted ASO411 so that its scope became national.

In 2013, the Working Group supported the expansion of the site to include HCV service providers, and HIV411.ca and HCV411.ca were launched by CATIE administrators in June 2014.

The current web application for HIV411/HCV411 has been implemented primarily using ASP, Microsoft SQL Server, Javascript and the Google Maps API.

If the current website is to be replaced with a new web application, it is our vision that it be implemented using open-source or free-use technologies that CATIE can support in the future, including (but not necessarily limited to):

- PHP
- MySQL
- JavaScript
- Google Maps API
- Linux web hosting

A working copy of the site can be hosted on a development web server of the respondent's choice for the duration of the project. When launching the completed project, it will be transferred to one of CATIE's existing web servers.

## **3. Objectives**

This project aims to achieve the following:

### **3.1 Make HIV411.ca/ HCV411.ca mobile-friendly:**

The HIV411.ca/ HCV411.ca website was adapted from ASO411, a website that was created in 2009 and originally designed for people using desktop computers. At present, most people who use HIV411 services are looking for local services 'on-the-go' from their mobile phones or tablets. It is aspired to take the existing information and optimize it for smaller screens.

### **3.2 Provide an English and French toggle option:**

CATIE is a bilingual organization so it is imperative that services and information are available in both languages. The current HIV411/ HCV411 website is available in English and French but when a person searches the listings, the information that comes up in searches does not do a bilingual search.

### **3.3 Make the viewer's search for services easier to perform by allowing the system to search for specific words in the map:**

The current system allows users to enter their city or postal code and then select one of ten services listed in the right-hand menu bar for the map to populate. CATIE is looking to improve the search experience and broaden the search option. For example, allowing a user to search the name of the organization by typing it in the search box would improve the functionality of the site.

### **3.4 Simplify and make the icons used cleaner:**

After entering a search for a service, multiple options come up on the map and the map looks messy due to the appearance of many icons when multiple organizations are located in the same area. We are interested in improving the look of the map, and open to suggestions on how we can accomplish this.

### **3.5 Add the extra feature of linking out to other mapping services:**

CATIE would like an extra tab in the menu that would link out to other mapping services that would complement the HIV411/ HCV411 website. This extra page could be named "Additional community tools." It would provide external links and a brief description of the service map's content.

It would also be preferred if the feature would permit our adding other organizational mapping services to the site, as they came available.

Here are the maps we would like to add as well as their descriptions:

## **4. About Your Company**

CATIE will only contract with an agency that has a solid reputation and proven capability in the areas of expertise required for this project.

**4.1** We would ask that you supply 3 references of clients that are similar to CATIE in size and requirements, indicating the nature and scope of the work you did for them and the date of the project.

**4.2** Give a brief description of your agency, including the full range of your services. Please give examples of similar work you have developed for other clients.

**4.3** Supply any relevant promotional materials.

## **5. Instructions and Response to Request for Proposal**

Bids must include:

- a bid summary sheet that includes a detailed breakdown of costs related to fixing current system or/ and replacing current system;
- your agency's proposed work plan and timeline to address the objectives identified in Section 3;
- confirmation that you have read and accepted contents of the documents contained in this RFP; and,
- contact details of at least three (3) customers who can be approached for references.

This RFP process is not intended to create a formal legally binding procurement process and shall not give rise to the legal rights or duties applied to a formal legally binding procurement process.

Neither party shall have the right to make claims against the other with respect to this RFP process, the selection of any vendor or the failure to be selected.

All information requested should be provided in the order and format of the Sections.

CATIE may cancel this RFP process at any time.

CATIE may elect not to consider, or cancel a contract awarded to, a Respondent whose submission contains misrepresentations or any inaccurate, misleading or incomplete information.



The Respondents will bear their own costs associated with or incurred through this RFP process, including any costs arising out of, or incurred in, the preparation and making of a submission; or any interviews, negotiations or other activities related to this RFP process.

Closing date: Responses must arrive no later than **16:00 hr. ET on August 16, 2016**. Any RFPs received after the closing date will not be considered.

## **6. Evaluation of Responses**

The aim is to evaluate the responses and interview a short list of applicants. We will award the contract to the bidder determined to offer best value. CATIE reserves the right not to accept the lowest or any RFP.

## **7. Timeline**

The dates listed below are estimates and should serve as a rough guideline. The respondent of this RFP may have a suggested timeline as to when they will be able to complete the outlined objectives in Section 3, which can be proposed and which would be subject to approval by CATIE.

August 16, 2016: Deadline to submit RFP

August 22, 2016: CATIE will assess all RFPs and may contact candidates with further questions.

August 25-26, 2016: CATIE will invite agencies for a face-to-face interview to determine the best candidate.

August 29, 2016: The successful candidate will be notified and a contract will be signed.

September 5, 2016: Work on the project will commence.

October 31, 2016: Deadline for project completion.

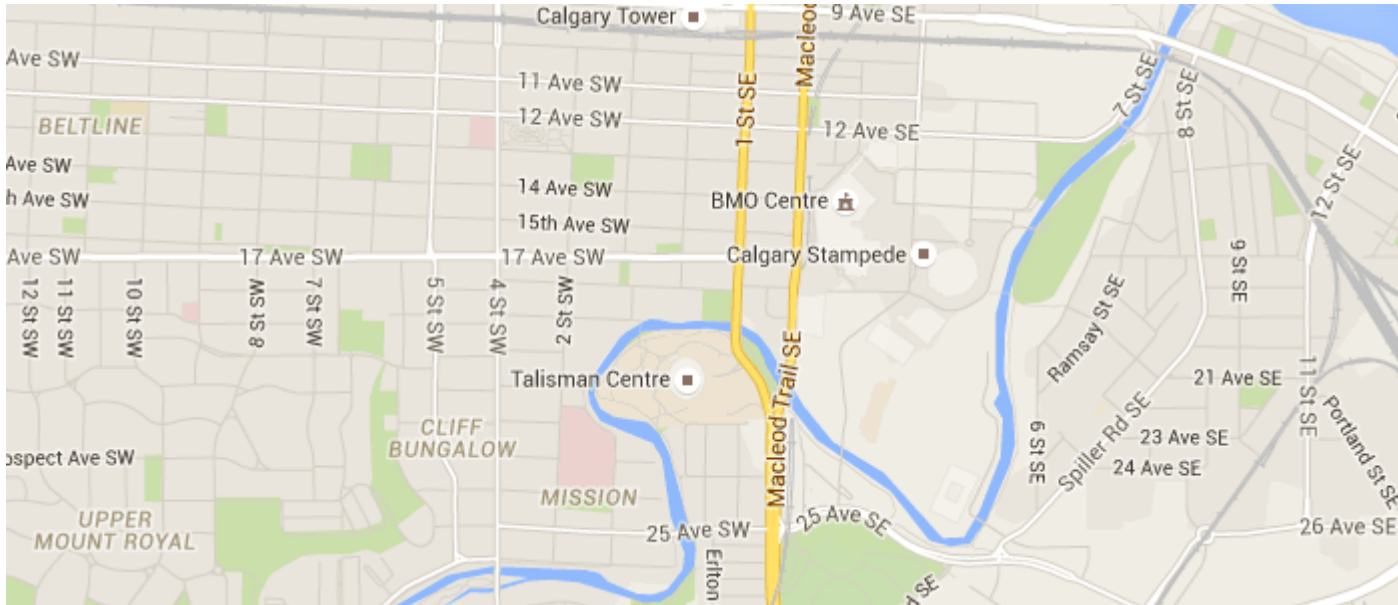

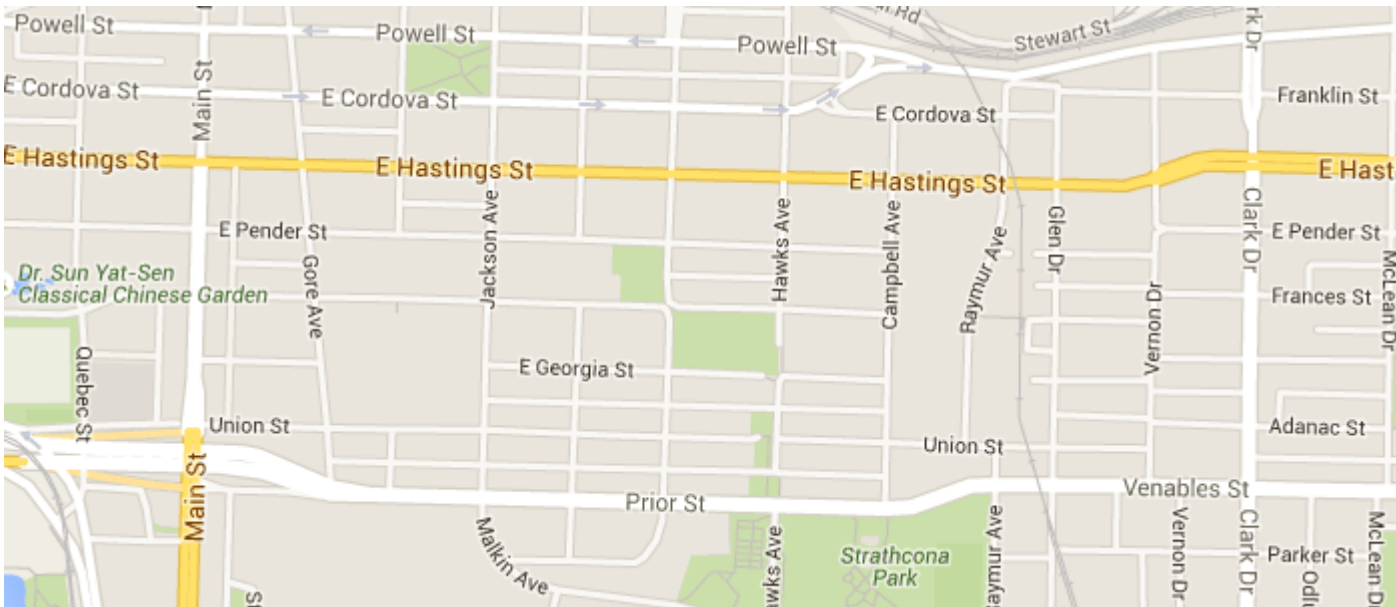
