It is time to restore the kinship systems among the Indigenous people, to gather as tribes and look for the strengths of the people, to begin once more the close relationships we have with one another as human beings, to restore relationships with the land, the water, the plants and the animals, and to honor the Creator in the restoration of kinship.

Keynote Kinship Speakers: Women, Men, Youth & Two Spirit People of Turtle Island



Sylvia McAdam: Born and raised on the Big River Reserve in Treaty Six Territory. She holds degrees in law and human justice and teaches at the First Nations University. One of four women who are founders of the Idle No More movement which has gained world-wide recognition as a positive and "peaceful revolution to honour Indigenous sovereignty, and to protect the land and water."

Joseph Fossella: Member of the Sechelt band in British Columbia, Canada. Counsellor/Facilitator for Warriors Against Violence Society for over eighteen years addressing the issue of family violence. Extensively worked in the First Nations community and has experience providing programs, workshops, train the trainer and sharing circles for men, women, youth and families.



Colby Tootosis: Life Skills Coach, a Grief & Recovery Specialist, and an avid wood splitter. Passion to embrace the development of a new generation of Indigenous leadership, which is vital for the continuing wellbeing of Indigenous children who have yet to arrive. He sees the solutions to the crisis Nations face through the hearts and minds of the young Indigenous people and he is looking forward to assisting in the awakening of what is dormant inside.

Albert McLeod: Status Indian with ancestry from Nisichawayasihk Cree Nation and the community of Norway House in northern Manitoba. Founder of the Manitoba Aboriginal AIDS Task Force, with over twenty years of experience as a human rights activist and is one of the directors of the Two-Spirited People of Manitoba. A free-lance educator specializing in Aboriginal cultural reclamation, textile art, and community development.
