1. HIV means Human Immunodeficiency Virus.	True <i>"HIV : the Human Immunodeficiency Virus."</i> HIV means Human Immunodeficiency Virus
2. There is a difference between HIV and AIDS.	True. <i>" Only the advanced stage of infection is called AIDS, Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome."</i>
3. A person infected with the HIV virus is HIV positive.	True <i>"Once HIV is in the body, it infects blood cells that are essential for the body to fight illnesses... A person infected with the HIV virus is "HIV positive".</i>
4. There is only one way of transmitting HIV.	False <i>"...the AIDS virus can spread only in a number of very specific ways."</i>
5. You can be infected by the AIDS virus through unprotected sexual intercourse.	True <i>"Unprotected sexual contacts are the most common means of transmission."</i>
6. You can be infected by the AIDS virus by kissing an HIV-positive person.	False <i>"There is no risk in touching, kissing or hugging an HIV positive person."</i>

It is essential to use blades or needles only once." Higher risk of Hepatitis transmission in some cases.</i>
10. You can be infected by the AIDS virus by working with or touching an HIV-positive person.	False <i>"It is impossible to catch HIV by touching an infected person".</i>

11. The AIDS virus can be transmitted from a mother to her child during pregnancy, childbirth or breast feeding.	True <i>"HIV can also be transmitted by an HIV-positive mother to her child, during pregnancy, at birth or by breast feeding."</i>
